Resolution presented to the Faculty Senate Executive Board by Past President David Hopper. The resolution was unanimously passed by the Executive Board at its October 2, 2001 meeting.

Where as:

Tenure line faculty are essential to maintaining and enhancing the quality of undergraduate and graduate education and the research and service missions of the University,

Where as:

There has been a steady decline in the number of tenured faculty from 1,284 in 1985-86 to 1,077 in 2000-01,

Where as:

The number of tenure line faculty have increased by +4.1% and +25.9% respectively, at the University of Iowa and the University of Northern Iowa from 1885-2001, and declined by -11.3% at Iowa State University during the same period,

Where as:

During the period 1985-2001 the number of FTE P&S staff has increased by 68.6% from 1,320 to 2,226 positions

Where as:

The university administration cut 30 faculty positions in 1999-2000 and another 70 faculty positions in 2000-2001,

Where as:

Enrollment has increased by nearly 1,400 students, from 26, 431 in 1986 to 27,823 in 2001

Where as:

President Geoffroy stated at the September 18, 2001 Faculty Senate meeting that his highest priority is "to increase the number of tenure and tenure track faculty"

BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The Faculty Senate strongly recommends to the university administration that there be no further reductions in the number of tenure line faculty at Iowa State University.
