I. SIGNIFICANT TRENDS:

Human Sciences has added one new online undergraduate major, Early Childcare Education and Programming and a new undergraduate Health Coach certificate. Numerous curricular modifications are planned to align programs with emerging disciples and societal needs.

Summary of Changes for AESHM Apparel, Merchandising, and Design (AMD) 2016-2017

General Education:

• One notation for Product Development: Innovation (primary and secondary option combination) that Chemistry is required. This is an unknown in terms of demand; in the short term this impact on Chemistry will be very small.

Professional Core:

- Addition of COM S 113 (Databases and Spreadsheets) (3 credits) as a required class in the professional core.
- AESHM 113 (Professional Development for AESHM) changes to 1 credit (from 2 credits).

Design Primary Option:

- AMD 206 takes the place of AMD 301 for delivery <u>after first year</u> (Students in design have a review of their design skills (AMD 206 Design Selective Advancement) after AMD 121 Apparel Assembly, AMD 131 Overview of the Fashion Industry, AMD 178 Introduction to Fashion Design Studio, and AMD 204 Textile Science.)
- AMD 310 CAD Patternmaking added and AMD 426 (Creative Design Process) moved to a select category with AMD 329 (Digital Textile and Apparel Design).
- Deletion of SCM from select from list.
- AMD 178 (Introduction to Apparel Design Studio) changes to 3 credits (from 2 credits)

Product Development Primary Option:

- A core of required classes created from current selections. Remainder of classes and addition of new selections into two Secondary Options: 1) Line Development and Sourcing, and 2) Product Innovation. Delivery of two options accommodates merchandisers who want to drive the product management process and students who want a more technical approach to design and textile innovations.
- AMD 521 title changes from Digital Textile and Apparel Design to Digital Technologies in Design

Merchandising Primary Option:

- Added AMD 356 to the required category.
- Simplified secondary options to two choices: 1) The first choice is to do all coursework in AMD or AESHM, 2) The second option is to work with adviser to select 5 courses in approved academic areas to meet desired career goals. This approach is good for study abroad and transfer credits.

Summary of Changes for AESHM Event Management 2016-2017

Natural Sciences and Math

Added STAT 104, Introduction to Statistics, as acceptable statistics class.

Humanities

- Added CMDIS 286
- Added, INTST 235

Created a Core Courses section—all required classes

- EVENT 271, 371, 471, HSP M 101, AESHM 470F, and AESHM 474 all were moved from the "professional courses" section. (Still required)
- EVENT 289 and HSP M 260 were moved from the former "30 category" (elective requirement) to required classes.

Professional Courses

Renamed "30 Category (Choose 30 credits from the selection below)" section as Event Management Electives

- Lowered total credits to 24 cr.
- Removed EVENT 289 and HSP M 260—as those got shifted to "core classes"
- Removed: HSP M 333, HSP M 380, HSP M 380L, HSP M 487, MGMT 370, SP CM 312

Summary of changes for FSHN

The Department of Food Science and Human Nutrition in conjunction with the Departments of Kinesiology and Psychology have created an undergraduate health coach certificate.

The Department anticipates significant change to the undergraduate dietetics didactic program and the Dietetic Internship graduate certificate. Proposed changes by the professional accrediting body will necessitate significant change to curriculum in the next few years.

Summary of changes for HDFS

The Child, Adult and Family Services major now requires students to complete Stat 101 for their Natural Sciences and Mathematical Disciplines requirement.

The Early Childhood Education major no longer requires students to complete 3 years of foreign language in high school or 2 years of world languages and cultures at the college level.

Additional courses for the Family and Consumer Sciences Education and Studies, Teacher Licensure option were added to provide students more options in a required content area where students may choose to focus.

The Financial Planning emphasis in Financial Counseling and Planning is registered with Certified Financial Planner Board of Standards Inc. as a CFP Board-registered Program, ISU courses satisfy CFP Board's education requirement, allowing an individual to sit for the CFP® Certification Examination.

Summary of changes for KINES

Changes in the Community and Public Health (CPH) option have been discussed to allow the option to more directly reflect our departmental focus on physical activity. Feedback from students and faculty discussion emphasized the importance of retaining the CPH option (and name) to allow us to continue to serve this need. However, there was consensus that neither the CPH option nor the Exercise Science option fully capture the needs of other Kinesiology students interested in physical activity programming. Therefore, we propose a new option (Physical Activity and Health Promotion (PAHP)) that will enable us to provide different training for two distinct health-related career outlets.

- The CPH option will be refocused on qualifications as a Certified Health Education Specialist (CHES).
- o Students will be prepared for careers in health and human service agencies (e.g. state or county health offices, or various public health agencies) that serve to address health disparities and broad health issues facing communities.
- o Proposed coursework (modifications) include adding several key courses (e.g. HDFS 269 and HS 464 or VmPM 428) to provide better training in public health. The Exercise Psychology course (Kin 366) will be replaced with Health Psychology (Psy 485) to provide broader coverage on health topics. Worksite health promotion (HS 380) will be dropped from this option.
- The PAHP option will focus on qualifications for credentialing as a Physical Activity Public Health Specialist.
- o Students will be prepared for careers directly focused on the promotion of physical activity and healthy lifestyles in society. Relevant opportunities could be in YMCAs, worksite fitness, community centers or health promotion agencies
- o Proposed coursework will include 3 of the same courses as CPH (HS 310, HS 430 and HS 464), 3 of the same courses as Exercise Science (KIN 259, KIN 366, and KIN 458) and 2 courses unique to the option (HS 380 and KIN 467). It will be further distinguished with additions of coursework in FSHN (364, 365 or 366) to provide coverage in nutrition and obesity. The option will be aligned with required KIN courses for the Health Coach Certificate to facilitate completion of this certificate.

Summary of changes for SOE

A name change was made in the Graduate Certificate formerly called Social Justice in Higher Education. It is now called Education for Social Justice.

This change along with changes in the names of several courses better reflect the focus on education across levels.

The SOE is currently undertaking a review of its undergraduate endorsement areas and changes in these will likely be forthcoming.

II. CURRICULA, MAJORS, MINORS ADDED OR DROPPED:

Majors Added: HD FS department added the Early Childcare Education and Programming (E C P) major offered by the Great Plains Interactive Distance Education Alliance (GPIDEA). The major is designed to prepare graduates to work in a variety of early care and education programs in local communities and on military installations.

Minors Added: none

Certificates Added: Health coach undergraduate certificate – collaborative effort of the Departments of Food Science and Human Nutrition, Kinesiology and Psychology.
