Students in the RATE program address significant and enduring questions about rural and agricultural communities throughout world history, technologies developed and employed by these communities, and environmental contexts in which they operate.

Provide a brief rationale for the requested action.

The College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, as part of the Reimagining LAS initiative, has significantly reduced the budget for the Department of History, resulting in the inability to continue funding the RATE program.

Describe how students currently admitted to or eligible for admission to the program will be accommodated; what kind of transition period is planned; length of transition period.

The Department of History proposes a five-year sunset period, officially suspending admissions in Fall 2024 and graduating remaining RATE students in 2-5 years.

Describe the effect on costs of reducing enrollments or terminating the program, e.g., cost savings, resource reallocations, etc.

Program suspension will reduce direct costs by approximately \$110,000 annually.

- Is program available elsewhere in the state? Identify the schools where the program is available and the current enrollment at those sites.

The University of Iowa has a general doctoral program in history. The department reported 27 current PhD students in the program.

Department of History graduate courses enroll students from graduate programs in Sustainable Agriculture, Anthropology, Classical Studies, Community and Regional Planning, English, Sociology, and Women and Gender Studies.

- What is the anticipated impact on minorities and women?

Our seminars' focus on issues of gender and race in the histories of rural life, agriculture, and technology has drawn many women into our graduate program.

- Is a reduction in faculty, staff, facilities, etc. anticipated?

While no direct reduction in faculty can be attributed to the suspension of the RATE PhD program, faculty time will be shifted from the doctoral program to the needs of our undergraduates.
